A. Well, it was the two gentlemen that I met outside the house.

Q. What happened then?

A. So, one of them came out and said the Pa said I should wait a little bit and he was coming. So we sat there for some time but he did not come out. So I told the guy that both of us should enter the parlour and to explain to him the purpose of my visit, and we met the doctor at the parlour. He said, "Young man, how are you"? I, too, responded.

He told me that he was waiting for his shirt, that he told his wife to bring a shirt. That was why he was waiting. And, from that, I told him that Bockarie said I should arrest him and take him to him. He said, "What have I done"? I said, "Well, I don't know, until I take you to Bockarie. Then he would be able to explain to you why you have been arrested". Then the Pa walked from his parlour, went to the pick-up. He sat at the back seat of the pick-up.
